Sunday's Gospel

Mark 5:21-24. 35-43

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark Young girl, I say to you, arise.

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet

and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him.

Some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kum!' which means, 'little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.

A beginning point for discussion of this week's Gospel with children:

- Why was Jairus so worried?
- Do your parents worry when you or your brothers or sisters are sick?
- Why do we pray for people who are sick?
- Can you think of any times when Jesus healed someone who was sick?

School Fees & Levies

Statements for school fees & levies for 2024 will be emailed over the holidays. Please check your statement and contact the office if you have any questions.

For families paying by direct debit, this statement emailed was for your records only and not a request for payment. Direct debit payments will commence shortly and continue through to the end of November or early December. Please note – it is never too late to start paying by direct debit – please complete the direct debit request and return to the office.

The school provides a variety of options for payment of school fees and levies - in full at the start of the school year / part payment at the start of each school term / by direct debit – weekly, fortnightly, or monthly / by direct payment into the school bank account or by regular payments at the school office by cash or EFTPOS. You can even pay over the phone if you wish.

If you choose to pay by direct payment into the school account, please ensure that you identify the payment by family name or account number (top of the statement). You will find the bank account details for direct payments printed on the bottom of your statement.

It is expected that all school fees and levies are finalised by the start of December 2024.



- Cooking and baking



How do I book a place?

You can book a place through <u>My Family Lounge</u> app (our online booking and enrolment system). We have a step-by-step guide on our website on how to enrol using the app. Please note that bookings cannot be made by phone or email and all bookings made less than seven days prior to the activity incur an additional charge.

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What to wear (clothing)

To ensure your child feels comfortable and can engaged in all activities, we ask they wear:

- Comfortable clothing
- Closed shoes and socks
- Hat for sun protection (all year round)
- · Warm clothing for cooler months
- · Clothing that is suitable for art activities leave the good clothes at home!

What to bring (food, safety gear)


